FACTS ABOUT FOSTER CARE IN TENNESSEE

- There are around 8,000 foster children across the state of Tennessee.
- Children over the age of 8 have a 20% chance of adoption.
- Most children stay in the system until they age out at the age of 18.

SERVICE PROJECT DETAILS

- Tennessee 4-H Roundup and All Star Conference delegates are asked to bring in ten dollars (spare change or cash). All Tennessee 4-H members are encouraged to fundraise for this project. As with many things in life, output is determined by input; the more we as 4-H members put in, the greater the outcome for the foster children we are striving to serve. The success of this project will be determined by the amount of effort put in by Tennessee 4-H members.
- Non-competing delegates will use this money to go to the local Walmart. While there, they will buy toys or items of want for their “adopted” foster child.
- Funds should be turned in at the Roundup welcome event on Monday afternoon!
