



4-H Roundup Volunteer Leader Position Description

Position Title: Volunteer Leader at 4-H State Roundup and All Star Conference

Purpose of Position: To guide and supervise youth participating at 4-H State Roundup and All Star Conference in order to maximize the educational value of the experience and to ensure the safety of all participants.

Responsibilities:

- As a volunteer leader attending State Roundup and All Star Conference, your role is to be prepared to assist in making the event a positive experience for everyone, youth and other adults attending the event.
- The more you understand the purpose of the event, who will be attending, and all the activities that take place, the more confident you will feel about your role at the event. Learn as much as you can about the event by requesting information from the county agent and reviewing information on the state website:

- Participate in volunteer leader orientation at the county and/or regional level.
- Participate in delegate orientation at the county and/or regional level. Getting to know county delegates and their parents before participating in the event is an opportunity to establish communication with the delegates, and learn what they have accomplished enroute to Roundup. It also gives the youth an opportunity to get to know you, establish positive communication, and understand your role at the event.
- As a volunteer leader you are expected to:
 - Supervise and guide youth from your county, region as well as other youth in attendance, during the different activities and events that take place during Roundup.
 - Model all rules and guidelines for delegates.
 - Participate in volunteer leader orientation Monday night.
 - Assist with the logistics of specific activities and assume responsibilities as instructed by Extension staff.
 - Attend all activities and assist youth with: following the schedules, time management, and meeting curfews as established.
 - Communicate with regional staff, county agents, and state staff regarding concerns or questions.
 - Treat all youth fairly and not show favoritism towards any delegate (including your own personal child).
 - Engage in positive communication with delegates, show respect and interest in them as a person.

- Maintain sensitivity to individual differences in interest, abilities, personal needs, cultural heritage and religious beliefs.
- Follow all 4-H policies and procedures.

Qualifications:

- Enjoy working with adolescents.
- Have a positive attitude and an ability and willingness to engage in positive communication with youth and adults.
- Interest in contributing to the achievement of the objectives of the event.
- Sensitive and appreciative of differences in people and open to learning new concepts and meeting people.
- Physically able to walk around campus and endure long days of activities, with late night curfews.

Requirements:

- Must complete the volunteer application process, be approved by the County Extension Office, and be registered as a level 3 volunteer in SUPER 4-H Enrollment.
- Adhere to all 4-H rules and procedures.

Time Commitment: Time allotted for county orientation and/or regional orientation. During Roundup, you are “on duty” as the schedule and assignments indicate, including free time.

Benefits:

- Opportunity to work with youth and make a difference.
- Networking with other volunteers and youth leaders across the state.
- Great investment of your time and effort.... an investment in the future.
