**SPECIFIC BB COMPETITION RULES AND GUIDELINES
(2023 Revisions in Red)**

SAFETY

Safety is the number one concern of all match officials, adult leaders and competitors. Proper safety procedures will be followed and enforced at all times. Safety infractions may result in the disqualification of the shooter.

ENTRY FEE

There is a \$20.00 fee per individual shooter.

ELIGIBILITY

Entry in the state shoot is limited to youth who:

- Are enrolled in a Tennessee 4-H Shooting Sports Program
- Are within the age limits: Participants must meet the minimum 4-H age and may not compete after they are sixteen (16) years of age as of the date of the first shot going down range at the 2023 Daisy Nationals BB Gun Championship Match (DNBBGCM). If a competitor turns 16 on or before that date in July (date to be announce by Daisy), they are not eligible to shoot in this event.

SPECIAL RULE FOR THOSE WHO COMPETED IN THE DNBBGCM IN 2022

- These individuals may compete at the State Jamboree this year in the Champions Division and also may attend Daisy Nationals as a champion and compete in the Champions Match.
- Those individuals who competed as regular members of a team competing in the DNBBGCM in 2022 are precluded from firing as regular or alternate team members at this State Jamboree and/or the DNBBGCM this year. They may compete in the State Jamboree Champions Division for separate awards. These shooters are not eligible for a Daisy National qualifying team. This rule assures that new shooters will get a chance to compete.

EQUIPMENT

Official Guns: Official guns for this event, because it is a qualifying event for the Daisy National BB Gun Championship Match, are the Jaycee Target Special Model 299, Daisy Target Special Model 99 and the Avanti Champion Model 499 and 499B, Daisy Model 499B. No other guns are approved or permitted.

ON-LINE COACHES AND SCORING ASSISTANCE

Each team is advised to have three adults available to serve as on-line coaches for their shooters. See the NRA 5-Meter BB Gun Rules for information regarding coaching. It can be found at:

SCORING CHALLENGES

Only Shooters will be allowed to bring Scoring challenges. Coaches, parents, agents and volunteers will not be allowed to see targets. It is the responsibility of the shooter to know what they are challenging. See General Rules below.

ENTRY LIMIT

Each County will be able to bring 28 shooters who may shoot as 7 member teams or as individuals. Champion Division Shooters should not be listed as team members.

TEAM COMPETITION

Teams are composed of five regular members and up to two alternates representing the same group. Scores of team alternates do not count toward team total scores. All alternates compete as individuals.

CHAMPIONS DIVISION

Individuals who competed on a team as a regular team member at Daisy Nationals last summer are eligible to compete in the Champions Division Competition at the Jamboree. These individuals will be scored separately from the teams and regular individuals for awards.

DNBBGCM QUALIFYING (Daisy Nationals BB Gun Championship Match)

This competition is the Tennessee 4-H State Championship Match, and the top 3 placing teams (from different counties) earn an invitation to represent Tennessee 4-H at the Daisy National BB Gun Championship Match, at Rogers, Arkansas, home of Daisy, **July 2023**. Teams participating at the DNBBGCM will be limited to one per county unless there would not otherwise be three teams representing that state. Only those shooters who have fired in the Tennessee 4-H BB Jamboree may be selected to represent Tennessee 4-H at the DNBBGCM. A shooter must represent the same organization in both the State BB Jamboree and the DNBBGCM.

DAISY CHAMPIONS MATCH

Individuals who competed at the DNBBGCM last summer are eligible to compete in the Champions Match at Daisy this year. A shooter becomes eligible the following year after they have competed at the DNBBGCM as a regular team member.

RULES

Conduct of the competition will be governed by this set of rules and the current NRA 5-Meter BB Gun Rules, but may be modified by the competition superintendent. Any modifications to the rules will be made as "Match Bulletins" and will be made available to all coaches and shooters. See the NRA 5-Meter BB Gun Rules for information regarding Equipment (Sec 3). COURSE OF FIRE

The BB gun match consists of 40 shots for record fired at 5 meters (16 ft. 4 ¾ inches) in four stages with a 10 minute time limit for each stage as follows:

Match 1: 10 shots from the Prone position, NRA Rule 5.6.

Match 2: 10 shots from the Standing position, NRA Rule 5.12.

Match 3: 10 shots from the Sitting position, NRA Rule 5.8.

Match 4: 10 shots from the Kneeling position, NRA Rule 5.10.

Target: The official target will be an Orion electronic scoring target (5 Meter BB Target)

TEST

In addition to the regular course of fire outlined above, each competitor will be required to take a test covering topics on gun safety and marksmanship. Source material for the test will be the Daisy 10 Lesson Curriculum Guide and the NRA 5 Meter BB Gun Rule book. The exam will be worth 100 points and will be the equivalent of a firing stage. Exam scores will be figured into the team totals to determine the overall winning team and will be posted after the final shooting scores have been posted. No County will have access to questions ahead of time. Copies of the test

will not be given out. No cellphones or recording devices will be allowed in the testing area. This test will be administered in a computer format.

AWARDS

Awards will be given to the top individuals in each position. In addition, team awards will also be given. Awards will be given on the day of the event following the completion of shooting and score calculations. Scores will be posted online by noon, the Wednesday after the event. Any awards not picked up at the presentation on that day will be sent to the agents in participating counties to distribute.
