Did you know...

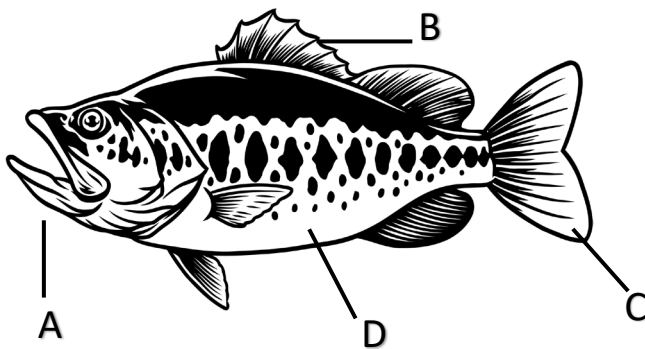
