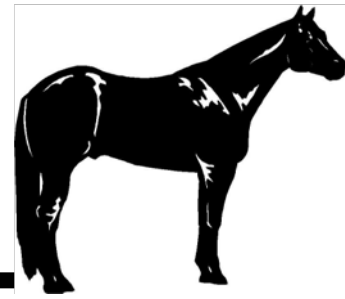


# Horse

## *What can I do...*

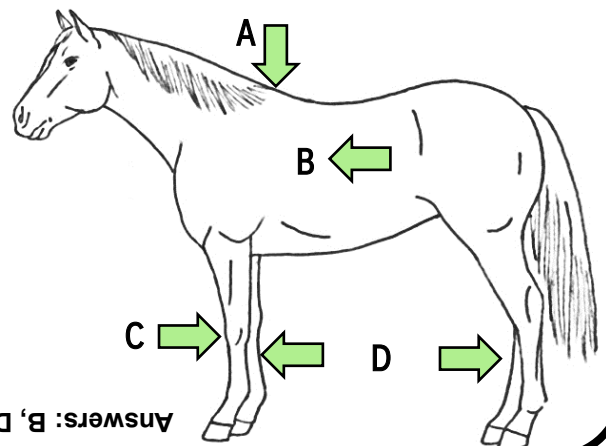
- Give a demonstration to your classmates on how to put on a saddle
