This activity gives you a glimpse of what the Plant Science project is about. Can you identify the parts of the flower?

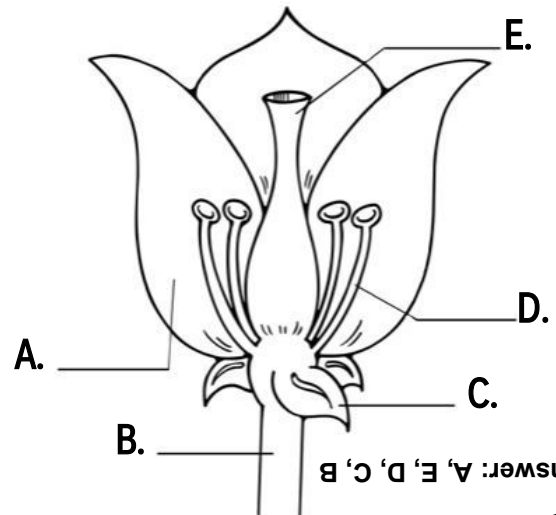

Work on this...

In the summer of 2026, Atlanta, GA will host one of the sixteen final games in the FIFA World Cup. Who or what is FIFA, you ask? And what is the World Cup?

FIFA stands for the Federation Internationale de Football Association. In the U.S.A., we have sports called football and soccer. But many other countries in the world call soccer, FOOTBALL. That's pronounced FUTE-BOLL.

What do you think the project area of Plant Science has to do with the Soccer World Cup? A hint – there is a team of specialists at the University of Tennessee Department of Plant Science that is overseeing the fields for the competition. Why are plant scientists involved in overseeing a soccer field?

Answer: They are overseeing the turf in the stadium. Turf is the grass that is laid on the field.
