Outcome: Create a monologue

Follow the steps below to create your monologue

1. Create
 - a) Establish the purpose
 - What is the reason for the monologue? Is it for the character to persuade, emotional release, confess, reflect, reveal a secret, etc. What is the primary emotion of the character?
 - b) Develop a character profile
 - Consider their background, personality, motivations, where they live, time period, etc.
 - c) Write a clear beginning, middle and end
2. Critique
 - a) Proofread and edit
 - b) Test and revise
 - Read aloud to others and ask for feedback
 - Make revisions based on feedback/self-assessment
3. Rehearse
 - a) Practice your monologue
 - b) Use appropriate gestures, where is inflection needed, do your facial expressions match the tone
4. Perform
 - a) Perform your piece for an audience
5. Reflect
 - a) Watch a video of your performance
 - b) Is there anything you would change or omit? Why or why not?
