

4-H Council Position Descriptions

President



The role of president includes presiding at all state 4-H council meetings and performing all other duties that usually pertain to the office. The president serves as the leading youth representative for Tennessee 4-H. They will meet supporters of the program as well as state and federal officials advocating for 4-H and agriculture.

Vice President



The role of Vice President includes helping plan and facilitate events and representing 4-H at meetings. The Vice President shall assist the President in conducting the work of the council. In the President's absence, the Vice President shall assume the duties of the presiding officer.

Secretary



The Secretary shall record the minutes of each meeting and distribute minutes to the State Council members before the next meeting. The Secretary will serve on the executive committee alongside the other top 4 State Council members.

Junior Representatives



This role includes serving as a youth ambassador for the organization. Helping to plan and promote state events, attend 4-H donor meetings, and represent the region from which they were elected on a state level

Senior Representatives



As a Tennessee 4-H Senior Representative, you will be responsible for representing other 4-H members in Tennessee by attending state-wide events and donor meetings. You will also help plan and organize 4-H's own state-wide events and will be responsible for marketing 4-H by social media posting and 4-H club visits.

Governor



The 4-H Congress Governor serves alongside the Congress Speakers as the main representative of Tennessee 4-H Congress. Unlike the Speakers, the Governor will not preside during a Senate or House session; however, they will serve at other events that the Speakers will not. The Governor also serves alongside other State Council members on the Executive Committee. The Governor will travel with this group on more trips and conferences.

Speaker of the Senate and House



The Speaker of the House and Senate will serve as mock speakers during the legislative sessions for Congress delegates. They will be tasked with running sessions on two different days in the Tennessee House of Representatives and Senate. During this time, speakers will stand behind the rostrum, the speaker's podium, directing the bill discussions.

All Star Chief



The State All Star Chief is the top youth leader within the Tennessee 4-H 4H Stars, serving as a role model and ambassador for the program. The Chief will preside at all meetings and perform duties usually pertaining to the office of the president. He/she shall be chair of the executive committee and will govern its activities.

All Star Deputy Chief



The State All Star Deputy Chief will assist the Chief in conducting the work of this organization and, in case of absence, assume full duties.

All Star Scribe



The Scribe will serve as secretary of the organization, fulfilling all duties of this office. A complete set of past minutes of All Star conferences and executive meetings will be maintained by the Scribe. He/She will keep a record of all meetings, both general and executive, during the term of office and submit copies of these records to the executive committee, the regional advisors, the state 4-H office, and the general membership when necessary. The Scribe will also conduct any correspondence of the organization.
